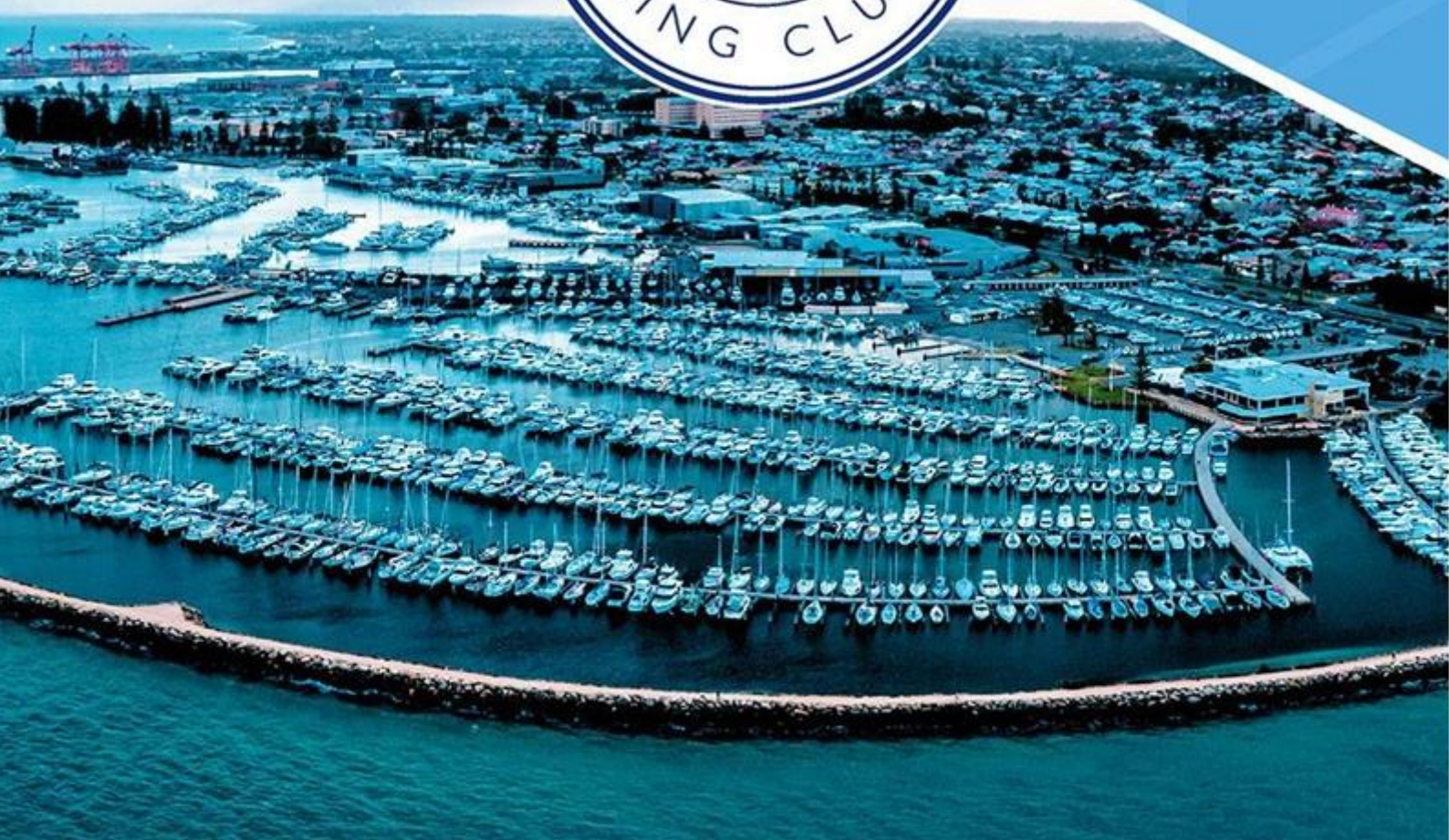

Fremantle Overview

This beautiful coastal port city, bounded by the Indian Ocean and the Swan River, is just 20 km from Perth. The City of Fremantle was established in 1829 as a port for the Swan River Colony and was the major city in Western Australia for much of its early history.

Fremantle's unique character is captured by its landscape, its heritage architecture, music, arts and culture, festivals, retail stores and markets, cafés, and restaurants, which all contribute to its village style atmosphere - making it a popular destination for local and international visitors.

Fremantle Sailing Club Overview

The Fremantle Sailing Club (FSC) is situated at Success Harbour and is historic in that it held races between Cutters along the South Fremantle foreshore and the main Harbour from 1879, and in 1906 conducted the first ocean race in Western Australia from Mandurah to Bunbury.

The current Club site was developed in 1979 and covers 28 hectares of water and 6 hectares of reclaimed land.

FSC has boat pens for 677 boats with town water, power, and telephone facilities available. Ample provision is made for slipping and lifting of crafts.

Visiting Vessels

Fremantle Sailing Club welcomes visiting vessels to stay in the marina for up to 90 days each year. The marina can accommodate powerboats, yachts, and multihulls up to 25m in length and encourages you to enjoy the extensive facilities that the Club has to offer.

Insurance

All vessels entering Fremantle Sailing Club are required to maintain Third Party and Public Liability Insurance to the value of ten million dollars (AUD 10,000,000).

Payment

Payment is required in advance at a mutually agreed frequency (daily, weekly, monthly etc.) Payment of all outstanding invoices is required prior to departure.

Marina Overview

Construction

Fremantle Sailing Club is a fixed marina with concrete jetties and steel/timber mooring piles.

Winds

Summer

Prevailing winds are offshore easterlies with a strong afternoon sea breeze, locally known as the 'Freo Doctor'.

Winter

Fremantle has mild winters, however low pressure systems can generate strong frontal winds and heavy rainfall. Wind gusts in excess of 60 knots are possible.

Tide

Fremantle experience mostly diurnal tides with a nominal tidal range is between 0.4 to 1.2m.

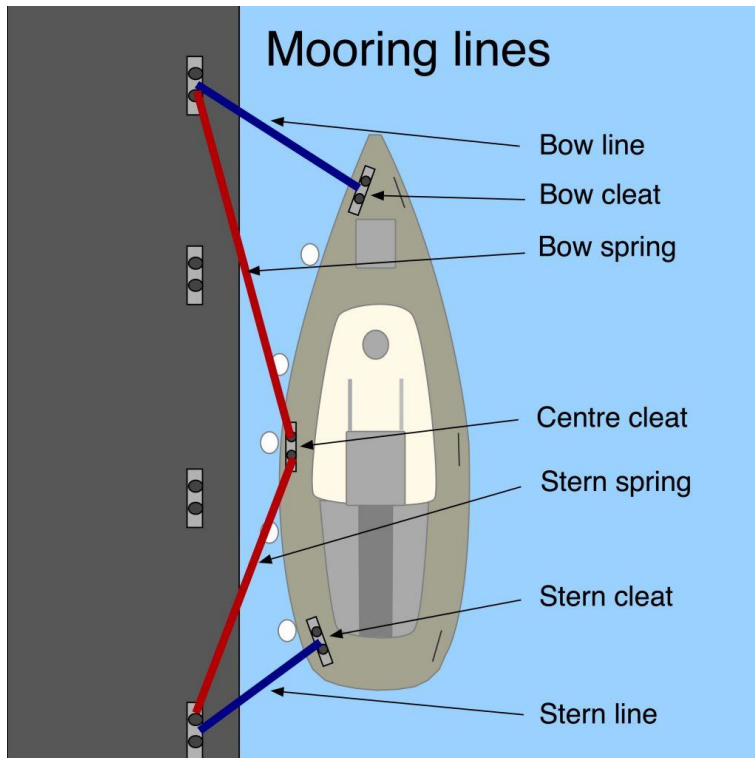
Depth

Water depths in the marina vary from 6m to 2m @ Low Water Mark (LWM).

Berthing

Most visiting vessels are berthed on our Collector Jetty on 1 of 7, 15m berths. Alongside berthing against a fixed concrete jetty with timber posts. Depth is approx. 2.1-2.5m @ LWM.

Med Moorings Lines

Our collector jetty berths have 'med mooring' lines fore and aft, see below, which assist to hold the boat clear of the jetty posts. When not in use, these lines sink to the seabed with the loop and float on the working end looped over the jetty posts, see below. Please be mindful of the lines on other boats when berthing on the Collector Jetty.



Fender Boards

The Harbour team can provide fender boards upon request.

Arrival

Access to Success Harbour is via a single entrance with separation marks (outer mark 32°04'S 115°44').

Please contact the Harbour Master on 0434 539 943 as you near the harbour and we will endeavour to meet you at the berth to assist with berthing and provide access keys etc.

Courtesy Mooring

If conditions or visibility are not suitable for berthing, a courtesy mooring is available inside the harbour adjacent the entrance.

Access keys

Each visiting vessel will be issued an access key on arrival. These provide 24-hour access to the vehicle and pedestrian gates needed to enter and exit the premise. Additional access keys can be requested.

On departure, access key/s can be returned to the Harbour and Facilities Office or placed in one of our two drop boxes.

1. Main club entrance (External wall).
2. Sailors Bar Coffee Deck. (External wall).

Failure to return an access key will result in a \$40 replacement fee.

Club Facilities

Club Membership

Access to the Club facilities is included in your visiting vessel fees. As a visitor of the Club, you are eligible for Temporary Membership for the period of your stay or up to a period of 90 days, whichever is greater. If berthing is required beyond 90 days, you would be required to join as a member of the club. More info [HERE](#)

Ablution Facilities

Showers and toilets are situated around the Club premises in three locations (accessible 24hrs).

1. Northeast corner of main building – corridor access past the kiosk window
2. Adjacent to the boat ramps
3. Behind works area office and workshop (Toilets Only)

Important: It is prohibited to use toilets onboard in the Harbour unless fitted with a sullage system. Sullage pump out facilities are available at the Fuel Jetty.

Laundry Facilities

Laundry Facilities are situated next to the Central Ablution Block opposite the Launching Ramps. Washing Machines and Dryers cost \$5.00 per load. Payment can be made by most major debit or credit cards. Washing powder available from reception.

Vehicle Parking

If you have a vehicle, parking is permitted in designated parking areas, however a temporary parking permit is to be obtained from the Harbour and Facilities Office.

Fuel Facilities

The Club has a fuelling jetty situated in the northern end of the Club premises and visitors are permitted to obtain fuel when required. Fuels available are Diesel, Unleaded and Premium Unleaded Petrol. The payment terminal takes most major cards.

Sullage Facilities

Sullage pump out is available on the Fuel Jetty. Simply connect the sullage hose to the outlet on the vessel using one of the supplied adapters then open the ball valve. No payment or pump activation required.

Library

The library, which is situated at the eastern end of the single-story building on the northern side of the main car park, has a good selection of books that can be borrowed. There is also a book exchange that offers visiting sailors the opportunity of swapping their paperbacks. This can be accessed with your access key or by visiting the Harbour Office or Reception.

Library Opening Hours are 8:30am to 5:00pm.

Animals/Pets

Under no circumstances are animals/pets permitted to be on Club premises except for guide dogs. An exception is made for dogs where the dog is being walked, on a lead, from a vehicle in the car park to the boat ready for immediate departure. You are, of course, required to pick up any droppings. No pets can be living aboard visiting vessels.
